



Core Georgetown Study findings*: To what extent do traditional "immersion" practices foster intercultural learning?

- Studying abroad for longer periods: Yes—some impact
- Maximizing contact with host nationals: No impact
- Enrolling in host institution classes: No impact
- Doing internships, service learning: No impact
- Maximizing contact with host nationals: No impact
- Being housed in home stays: No impact
- Pre departure cultural orientation: Yes—some impact
- Home stays: Yes—when students engaged with host family
- Receiving cultural mentoring at sites abroad: Yes—the highest impact practice in the study

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
Student Curriculum activity

- Orientation (based on Year or Semester)
 - Pre-departure
 - On arrival- locally and individual
 - Post arrival- 4-6 weeks in
 - Mid stay
 - End of stay- 4-6 weeks prior to going home
- Monthly learning reflections
 - Monthly guided reflections with trained volunteers
