

In Social Science :


Control is to bring people of society within the limits and compel them to adopt conformity to social norms

Control with respect to any Person, means the possession, directly or indirectly of the power to direct or cause the direction of the management policies of such Person










Problem Statement

"Controlled mind controls the body, and leads to a controlled system"








Indigenous medicine is the original system of Sri Lanka which has been practiced from 10th century.

There are many types of physicians; for Snake bites, Fractures, Hepatitis, Mental diseases and so on


They used astrology to identify the diseases

Influence of Buddhism on Indigenous Systems




Buddhism is the lime light of Sri Lankan civilization from ancient times

- Death ceremony





"Village tank Cascade Systems" or small scale irrigation technology is adopted





Village Tank Cascade System





Bisokotuwa of a Tank











Purposes of Different Tanks

- > Forest tank (Kulu Wewa): for wild animals
- Erosion control tank (Kayan Wewa): to trap sediment and controls salinity
- Olagam Wewa: used as a source of water for seasonal cultivation
- Storage tank: for the storage of water
 Village tank: for agriculture, as well as other community activities

Other Rain water harvesting Methods











Agriculture



Agriculture was a community activity

- Every stage in the cultivation is accompanied by ceremonies involving song, music and dance
- Tradition of mutual help, or kaiya, within each village
- Work has been distributed among the village members according to the age and gender

Protection measurements in Agriculture



- Rotation system was used for watching duty in the night
- Traditional cultivation did not compete with wild animals: made forest tank, kurulu paaluwa etc.
- Sprinkled milk rice on the field and provided dried branches of trees at convenient distances in the field, to eliminate pests
